RESIDENT'S SUCCESSES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

"I thank everyone in Safe Haven who helped me, especially Nia and Beth. They helped me with my studies and today I am at a university level, this is unbelievable.

C managed to secure her dream job and is currently working as a Creative Executive for

'Gayandlesbianweddings.com'

Since living in Safe Haven Sussex, M has got involved with lots of external services and now attends Yoga and Creative Writing classes, Recovery College, and the Women's Centre. Her confidence has grown a lot in the past few months particularly. She is now looking into her move on options so that she can work in the future.

MR has been successful with a loan application to set up his Epoxy Resin business. His business plan has been approved by manufactures. MR is currently waiting for advertising opportunities with outlets to be able to sell his products. He is extremely pleased with this as he thought he would never be able to be selfemployed.

IE has become a British Citizen and thought this would not be possible due to his circumstances. With support from his GP and SHS this has been achieved. IE has struggled with learning as a child and as an adult. He has recently returned to ESOL at MET College and is excelling. IE thought that he would not be able to learn due to his past difficulties but is pleased that he is able to learn and has said he feels positive about his future.

For more than thirty years, J worked as a journalist for national newspapers and magazines, specialising in interviews with people from the world of music, cinema, politics, and sport. J came to Safe Haven in 2018 after two years spent living in a tent in the woods. Undecided about what to do next, he was encouraged by his Safe Haven support worker to train with CGL to become a mentor to people on the homeless pathway. J now divides his time between teaching mindfulness, mentoring and his weekend job as a recovery worker for St. Thomas Fund.

J says he is grateful to Safe Haven for, 'putting a roof over my head, supporting me, and encouraging me to step out of my comfort zone and try new things.

JM has managed to secure a tenancy and plans to move out of Safe Haven within the next few weeks. He's been working with Just Eat for a while and has now decided it's time to leave the service and live independently
